Anne-Marie Descôtes

Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the French Republic to the Federal Republic of Germany

Ambassador Anne-Marie Descôtes is a graduate of the Ecole Normale Supérieure and the French National School of Public Administration ("Saint-Exupéry" Year). In addition to being a qualified German teacher,

she also holds a post-graduate diploma in Germanic Studies and a Bachelor's Degree in History of Art.

After her university studies, she taught German for two years before working for three years as a cultural attaché at the French Embassy in Bonn (1987-1990).

After graduating from the French National School of Public Administration (ENA), she was appointed to the European Cooperation Directorate at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs where she worked on issues such as extra-community relations and then intra-community affairs (1994-1997), before becoming a technical adviser in the office of Pierre Moscovici, Minister Delegate for European Affairs (1997-2001).

From 2001 to 2005, she held the positions of Special Advisor for Central and South-Eastern European enlargement at France's Permanent Representation to the European Union in Brussels. She was then appointed Special Advisor for Europe and the ex-USSR in Washington (2005-2008), and then Director of the Agency for French Education Abroad (AEFE) from 2008 to 2013.

During her time as Director-General for Global Affairs, Culture, Education and International Development from 2013 to 2017, she focused on mobilizing the Directorate-General and sous sherpa for G7 and G20, its network and its agencies and partners for economic and soft diplomacy, the environment and sustainable development.

She has held the position of French Ambassador to Germany since 6 June 2017.

She received the decoration of Officer in the National Order of Merit on 15 November 2018 and Chevalier in the Legion of Honour on 18 April 2014.







Dr Ingrid HammCo-Founder and CEO of Global Perspectives Initiative

Dr Ingrid Hamm is Co-founder and CEO of the Global Perspectives Initiative. She is deeply involved in the international dialogue on global development. Dr Hamm has been working in major German foundations for three decades, including 15 years at the Bertelsmann Foundation.

Most recently, from 2003 to 2015, she headed the Robert Bosch Foundation. In addition, Ingrid Hamm has served and continues to serve on German and international boards, including the University Council of the University of Tübingen, the General Assembly of the Goethe Institute, the Board of the European Forum Alpbach Foundation, and the Board of Trustees of the Karl Schlecht Foundation.



Katherine HayDeputy Director, Gender Equality at the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation

Katherine Hay is the deputy director, gender equality, at the Gates Foundation, where she leads several initiatives for women's economic empowerment. That work includes addressing barriers such as women's unpaid care work, closing gaps in women's employment and

enterprise, scaling successful platforms such as women's empowerment collectives, and closing gender data gaps. She supports her team to work with local experts to build sustainable in-country gender institutions and to identify and test local solutions. Katherine spent two decades in South Asia working on large scale women's empowerment, livelihoods, and health programs, bringing an intersectional gender lens to that work – asking, 'who is being left behind?' Before joining the foundation, she was an evaluation specialist at Canada's International Development Research Centre, where she led work on women's collectives, livelihoods, economic inclusion, and health equity. Katherine coined 'evaluation field building,' positioning evaluation as transformative, and wrote on, and led work in feminist evaluation and policy. Recent publications include work on gender norms and health systems, intimate partner violence, and women's groups.
